IARU Region 3 ARDF Championships is held at Ryuo-Town, Shiga-Prefecture, and around area (Kansai district) of Japan in 2026. Ryuo-Town is located in 30 km east of Kyoto station. The name of Ryuo literally means “Dragon King”.

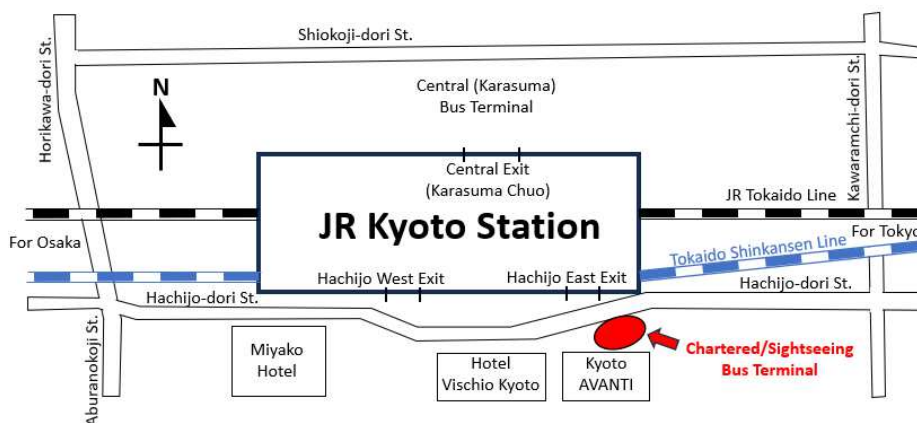

Transportation to the venue

From/To Kyoto station, we will arrange bus transportation on arrival/departure day at JPY 10,000 (round trip). Please apply for this service during entry procedure. Venue is located about 1 hour from Kyoto station. Kyoto station is about 2.5hour trip from Tokyo and 30 min trip from Osaka both by Shinkansen (Bullet train). Nearest international airport is Kansai airport (KIX). It takes about 1.5hours from KIX airport to Kyoto station by train. From Chubu Centrair airport (NGO), it takes also about 1.5hours to Kyoto via Nagoya.

- Bus schedule on 9th/Nov from Kyoto station: 11:00, 13:30
Depending upon entry information, the organizer will inform each team leader about bus departure time of your team. Please gather at the bus terminal 20 minutes before your bus departure time.
- Bus terminal: Hachijo-guchi, Chartered/Sightseeing Bus Terminal, access from south east of JR Kyoto station (Hachijo East exit)
- Bus schedule on 14th/Nov to Kyoto station: 09:00, 11:00
Detail will be discussed during the event with each team leader



For those who come directly to the event center by own car or taxi, please use “East Gate” of Kibougaoka Cultural Park, otherwise you should walk several kilometers to the event center named “Seinennoshiro”.



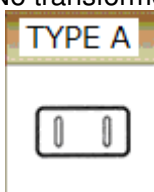
Accommodation

The accommodation will be organized in Kibougaoka Cultural Park in Ryuo-town, Shiga-prefecture. We will arrange Seinen-no-Shiro training and education center for the accommodation facility. We have no single rooms, but mainly big rooms (max 20 persons room). No showers are available in the room, but public big baths/showers are available for men and women separately.





Power outlet is type A and 100V, 60Hz.
No transformer and outlet adapter is available



Due to power capacity limitation, high power tools like hair dryer can not be used.

Please bring indoor shoes/sandal along with you, since no outdoor shoes allowed in the accommodation facility.

Also please bring your own towel/ soap/ teeth-brush along with you, since no such amenity available in this facility.

There are no shops in this facility. But some vending machine for soft drinks are available and you need JPY coins(10/100/500yen) to use.

Laundry machines are available and you need 100yen JPY coins.

Smoking is not allowed in this facility.

market which locates 5km from the event center and opens until 10pm

so that you can buy necessary commodity like water, snacks, fruits and so on. However, due to limitation of bus capacity we ask only 1-2 person from each as a representative of your team. (Cash and major credit card is accepted at the store.)

Entry fee and terms of payment

A) Total package for competitors and team officials:

If paid no later than June 30th - JPY 130,000.

If paid on July 1st and after - JPY 140,000.

This includes meals from 9th dinner to 14th breakfast, full boarding, transportation between hotel and competition area, competition fee and banquet.

B) Total package for visitors:

If paid no later than June 30th - JPY 100,000.

If paid on July 1st and after - JPY 110,000.

This includes meals from 9th dinner to 14th breakfast, full boarding, transportation between hotel and competition area, and banquet.

C) Transfer

JPY 10,000. This covers transportation between Kyoto station and the hotel, round trip by chartered bus. (Fee between Airport and Kyoto station is not included.)

D) Entry

Categories

In this championship, we have following categories in each competition.
(W15, M15 and M75 are special categories for this championships.)

Each society is able to entry one team in each category consist of up to 3 competitors throughout the event, except young star categories. Each society may entry 2nd team in W15, W19, M15 and M19, but these teams will be treated as unofficial for Reg.3 competitions.

Teams from IARU society outside IARU Reg.3 may entry this championships, but these teams will be treated as unofficial. All individual competitors including from unofficial team will be awarded at non-regional classification. Note that MRSF (Mongolia) is treated as Reg.3 society at ARDF activities.

Marking system

In this competition, we use SPORTident as marking system . We prepare SI cards for all of you, but we charge its value as compensation when you lost it.

Maedical Care and Insurance

First aid facilities will be available at the finish areas for all competitions. There is no cost to participants for on-site minor treatment, however the cost of ambulance transportation, emergency department visits, or clinic visits will be the participant's responsibility. Therefore, we strongly recommend purchasing insurance that covers such expenses.

Antenna system: 30cm Vertical, no counterpoise

Following are deviations from the rule.

*1) While transmitting, call sign will be sending intermittently according to Japanese regulation.

*2) In the 144MHz, we can't send A2A between 144.5 - 145.65MHz because of Japanese band plan. So we use between 145.65 and 145.80MHz.

*3) In 144MHz classic, channel space between TX1-TX5 and finish beacon is 120kHz due to our instruments reason.
